Lakewood Elementary School Construction Update and Schedule

DISD staff and the project consultants have provided a construction update and schedule of record. The progress report and anticipated construction schedule is as follows:

- Excavation for the new addition and LOLA retaining wall is complete
- Critical work around the LOLA area is complete and the area will be open for restricted use (Restricted use means certain areas of LOLA will have fencing and signs to restrict access)
- Pier installation for the new addition and retaining wall is in progress
- The new addition is currently scheduled for occupancy November 2017, with winter break '17/'18 move in
- Utility relocation for the cafeteria expansion is being coordinated
- Relocation of the school marquee is underway
- The cafeteria expansion is scheduled for occupancy August 2017

Note that the construction of the 52,500 square foot addition is moving along as scheduled. Construction was delayed when DISD temporarily postponed award of the construction contract and subsequent permitting took a significant amount of time. DISD staff, their consultants and Big Sky (the general contractor) are working diligently to keep the construction on track and are hopeful that the above schedule can be met.



Recap of Addition & Renovations Highlights

- The proposed addition will be approximately 52,500 square feet in area, 2 stories in height, and will be located on the south side of the school in the location of the REMOVED (YEA!) 1st and 3rd modular buildings
- The Cafeteria expansion will add a 2nd serving line and increase the seating capacity to 384 (3-4 lunch periods, dependent on student population)
- 47 total classrooms (26 in new addition)
- New library
- 2 Art rooms
- Music room
- 2 computer rooms
- Several tutor rooms, special needs room, and speech room
- TAG room
- LOLA storage room
- High density book storage closets
- 2 teacher workrooms (accommodated in existing structure)
- Additional bathrooms
- Science and Nature Courtyard
- Improved circulation and teacher parking lot
- Existing 1951-building renovations will be limited to the cafeteria/kitchen expansion, reworking of the teachers' lounge, and reconfiguration of the library and various upstairs classrooms.
